Tips

To extend Tempest's nurturing pretend play, encourage storytelling by asking her to describe what she is doing and why, which builds language and narrative skills. Introduce simple caregiving routines like 'feeding' or 'dressing' the doll to deepen her understanding of daily life sequences. Incorporate related sensory activities, such as washing toy dishes or folding small clothes, to reinforce fine motor coordination and practical life skills. Finally, engage in shared play sessions to model social interactions, empathy, and cooperative play, supporting both cognitive and social-emotional growth.
