Tips

To deepen Aria's understanding of history through the dinosaur unit, encourage her to create a simple timeline of major prehistoric periods, using drawings or cut-out images to place key events or types of dinosaurs along a chronological line. Visiting a natural history museum or a virtual tour of fossil exhibits can make the learning concrete and memorable. Incorporate storytelling by having Aria imagine and narrate a 'day in the life' of a particular dinosaur, weaving facts into creative expression. Furthermore, linking dinosaur history to modern-day animals can foster connections about evolution and environmental change over time.
