

Core Skills Analysis

English / Language Arts

- Joshy practiced listening comprehension by following the dialogue and lyrics in the K-Pop Demon Hunters film, improving his ability to extract main ideas from spoken media.
- He identified narrative elements such as setting, characters, and conflict, showing early story-structure analysis skills.
- Joshy noted new vocabulary and idioms from both the Korean language and English subtitles, expanding his lexical repertoire.
- He reflected on the moral lesson of the film, practicing inferential reasoning to understand character motivations.

Media Arts

- Joshy observed visual storytelling techniques—camera angles, colour palettes, and animation style—developing a basic media-literacy framework.
- He recognized how music, sound effects, and rhythm in the K-Pop soundtrack influence mood and pacing.
- By discussing the film with peers, Joshy practiced collaborative critique, a core skill in media evaluation.
- He noted the use of cultural symbols (e.g., hanbok, Korean pop icons) and how they support the story's theme.

Humanities & Social Sciences (Culture)

- Joshy gained exposure to contemporary South Korean pop culture, linking music, fashion, and mythology.
- He compared traditional demon-hunter folklore with its modern reinterpretation, enhancing cultural-historical awareness.
- The social group setting encouraged him to share personal reactions, promoting cross-cultural empathy.
- He recognized how global media (K-Pop) can influence identity and community belonging.

Personal & Social Capability

- Participating in a 2-hour group activity helped Joshy practice social interaction and turn-taking during group discussions.
- He practiced respectful listening while peers shared reactions, fostering interpersonal communication.
- The shared experience supported emotional regulation by offering a fun, low-stress environment to experience excitement and suspense.
- He demonstrated self-management by staying focused for the duration of the 2-hour session.

Tips

To deepen Joshy's learning, set up a “movie-to-real world” comparison activity where he sketches how a scene from the K-Pop Demon Hunters could be staged in his backyard, linking narrative structure to physical design. Follow with a short writing assignment where he rewrites the climax from a different character's viewpoint, reinforcing perspective-taking. Plan a short cultural research project where he explores one real-world Korean tradition seen in the film (e.g., traditional costumes) and presents a mini-presentation to the group. Finally, arrange a creative music-and-movement session where the class creates a short rhythm-based dance to a song from the movie, reinforcing rhythm, teamwork, and cultural appreciation.
