# **Core Skills Analysis**

## **English**

- Leela practiced active listening by following the dialogue and songs in the Veggie Tales episode, strengthening auditory processing skills.
- She identified the story's beginning, middle, and end, reinforcing narrative structure comprehension.
- New vocabulary such as "drummer," "Bethlehem," and musical terms were introduced, expanding her word bank.

### **History**

- The episode introduced Leela to the historical setting of the first Christmas in 1st-century Judea.
- She learned how early people celebrated the birth of Jesus, connecting past customs to today's holiday traditions.

- She began to see how stories from centuries ago still influence modern cultural celebrations.

### Science

- Listening to drum beats helped Leela notice how vibrations create sound, a basic physics concept.
- She observed cause-and-effect: striking the drum produces a louder sound, reinforcing simple experiments with force and result.
- The rhythm patterns introduced concepts of timing and beat intervals, laying groundwork for understanding wave patterns.
- Discussion of the drum's materials (wood, skin) gave a glimpse into how different substances affect sound quality.

#### **Social Studies**

- During free play, Leela practiced sharing, turn-taking, and cooperative problem-solving with neers
- The Veggie Tales story highlighted cultural traditions surrounding Christmas, fostering cultural awareness.
- She identified community roles—musicians, storytellers, caretakers—illustrating how societies work together.
- Leela's empathy grew as she related to the drummer boy's desire to give his best gift to the newborn king.

#### **Bible**

- Leela heard the nativity narrative focused on the drummer boy, reinforcing the biblical account of Jesus' birth.
- Key themes of worship, giving gifts, and using one's talents for God were presented clearly.
- She learned biblical names and places such as Bethlehem, shepherds, and the newborn King.
- The story encouraged a moral lesson: honor God by offering what you have, no matter how small.
