Geography

- Henry identified that koalas live in Australia, linking the animal to its continent and geographic region.

- He observed specific physical adaptations (two thumbs and three fingers) that enable koalas to thrive in tree-based habitats, linking anatomy to environment.
- He recognized unique behaviors such as tree-to-tree jumping and the tiny size of newborns, illustrating how a species fits into its ecological niche.

Tips

To deepen Henry's geographic and ecological understanding, try a hands-on map activity where he places pictures of koalas, kangaroos, and wombats on a large map of Australia, discussing climate zones and habitats. Follow up with a simple family-tree chart that groups marsupials together, reinforcing classification skills. Create a sensory "Koala Habitat" box with eucalyptus leaves, bark, and branches for role-play, letting Henry act out how the animal moves and feeds. Finally, read another short nonfiction book about Australian wildlife and have Henry compare the new information with what he learned about koalas, encouraging critical thinking and vocabulary growth.

- <u>Australia: The Amazing Land Down Under</u> by National Geographic Kids: An engaging picture book that showcases Australian landscapes and its iconic animals, helping children connect geography with wildlife.
