

Core Skills Analysis

English / Language Arts

- Identified differences in narrative pacing between the manga panels and the anime episodes, demonstrating comprehension of story structure.
- Compared dialogue style, noting how speech bubbles versus voice acting affect tone and character voice.
- Analyzed descriptive language by contrasting visual details shown in artwork with those conveyed through narration or subtitles.
- Evaluated how themes such as loss and friendship are highlighted differently through written text versus visual and auditory cues.

Visual Arts

- Observed the use of colour, line, and composition in manga panels versus animated frames, building visual literacy.
- Recognised how lighting and motion in the anime create mood that static manga images suggest through shading and panel layout.
- Described the impact of character design consistency across both media, noting any artistic liberties taken in animation.
- Explored the role of background art in establishing setting, comparing the detail level in hand-drawn pages to digitally rendered scenes.

Media Studies / Digital Technologies

- Distinguished the production processes of print manga (drawing, inking, printing) from anime (storyboarding, voice recording, digital animation).
- Discussed how sound design, music, and timing in the anime add layers of meaning absent from the manga.
- Identified the target audience considerations that influence adaptation choices, such as episode length versus chapter length.
- Evaluated how cultural symbols are preserved or altered when moving from page to screen.

Critical Thinking & Humanities

- Formulated arguments supported by evidence from both media to explain why certain scenes feel more impactful in one format.
- Connected the story's historical fantasy setting to real-world myths, enhancing cultural awareness.
- Reflected on personal emotional responses, linking them to specific artistic choices in each medium.
- Developed criteria (e.g., fidelity to source, emotional resonance, visual clarity) to assess the effectiveness of the adaptation.

Tips

To deepen the comparison, have the student create a Venn diagram that maps shared plot points, characters, and themes, then add a third section for unique elements of each medium. Next, stage a short drama where they reenact a scene first as described in the manga and then as performed in the anime, noting how performance choices change meaning. Follow up with a research mini-project on how Japanese storytelling traditions influence both manga and anime, using library resources or

reputable websites. Finally, encourage the learner to design their own storyboard panel that merges the strengths of both formats, applying the visual and narrative techniques they observed.
