## Math

- The child learns the concept of probability by understanding that there are two possible outcomes when tossing a coin: heads or tails.
- They learn to identify and differentiate between the two sides of a coin, recognizing that heads represents one outcome and tails represents the other.
- The child practices counting and basic addition skills by tallying the number of times the coin lands on heads or tails.
- They explore the concept of fairness in probability, understanding that the chances of getting heads or tails are equal.

For continued development, encourage the child to create their own coin tossing game by using different coins with various probabilities. They can also explore the concept of fractions by determining the probability of certain outcomes in a coin toss.
