Physical Education

- The child learned how to observe and identify different types of mini beasts in their environment.
- They developed their gross motor skills by actively searching and moving around to find the mini beasts.
- They practiced their balance and coordination while navigating different terrains during the hunt.
- They learned about the importance of teamwork and cooperation when working with their classmates to search for mini beasts.

For continued development, encourage the child to create their own mini beast hunt at home or in the backyard. They can use different materials to make obstacle courses or hide mini beasts for their friends or family members to find. This activity can further enhance their physical skills and creativity.
