Social Studies

- The child learned about different types of insects and their habitats.
- They gained knowledge about the importance of insects in maintaining the balance of ecosystems.
- They developed an understanding of the interconnectedness of nature through observing how insects interact with their environment.
- The child learned about the diversity of insect species and how they can vary in appearance and behavior.

Continued development related to the mini beast hunt activity could involve creating a mini beast field guide, where the child can draw and describe different insects they encounter. They can also research and learn about specific insects in more depth, exploring their life cycles and unique characteristics. Encouraging the child to observe and document the behaviors and interactions of insects in their own backyard or local park can further enhance their understanding of ecosystems and ecological relationships.
