## **Social Studies**

- The child learns about cooperation and teamwork by playing games with their siblings.
- They develop an understanding of sharing and taking turns while engaging in activities with their siblings.
- Playing with siblings helps the child understand the concept of family and their role within it.
- They learn about conflict resolution and problem-solving when conflicts arise during playtime with their siblings.

For continued development related to playing with siblings, encourage the child to engage in imaginative play scenarios where they can take on different roles within a family or community. This will help them develop a deeper understanding of social dynamics and relationships.
