Math

- The child has learned addition and subtraction facts through interactive games.
- They have practiced counting and recognizing numbers up to 100.
- The child has improved their problem-solving skills by solving math puzzles.
- They have practiced basic geometry concepts such as identifying shapes and patterns.

For continued development, encourage the child to explore real-world math applications. This can include measuring ingredients while baking, counting money during shopping trips, or playing mathrelated board games.
