

## English Language Arts

- The child practices verbal communication by calling out the name of the person they pass the ball to.
- They learn vocabulary related to the activity, such as "pass," "catch," and "circle time."
- The child develops listening skills as they pay attention to who the ball is being passed to.
- They practice turn-taking and understanding basic instructions.

## Physical Education

- The child improves their gross motor skills by throwing and catching the ball.
- They enhance their hand-eye coordination as they aim to pass the ball accurately.
- They develop balance and coordination as they move around the circle to pass the ball.
- The activity promotes teamwork and cooperation as the child engages with others.

## Science

- The child learns about force and motion as they throw the ball and observe its trajectory.
- They explore concepts of gravity and how it affects the ball's movement.
- The child may experiment with different amounts of force to see how it affects the distance the ball travels.
- They develop an understanding of cause and effect as they see the ball move when they throw it.

## Social Studies

These variations will enhance their motor skills, creativity, and problem-solving abilities.
