## **English Language Arts**

- The child learned letter recognition by identifying and matching uppercase and lowercase letters.
- They practiced phonemic awareness by listening to and identifying the beginning sounds of words.
- The child learned sight words by reading and recognizing common words.
- They developed basic reading skills by sounding out and blending simple words.

For continued development, encourage the child to engage in interactive letter recognition activities using flashcards or magnetic letters. Provide opportunities to practice phonemic awareness by playing rhyming games or identifying the ending sounds of words. Encourage reading aloud with the child and discussing the meaning of new words encountered in books or everyday life.

- <u>The Alphabet Book</u> by P.D. Eastman: A fun and colorful book that introduces each letter of the alphabet with engaging illustrations.
