Art

- The child can learn about different art styles and techniques by observing the illustrations in the book "A Squash and a Squeeze". They can notice the use of lines, shapes, and colors to create the images.
- They can experiment with creating their own illustrations inspired by the story, using materials like crayons, markers, or colored pencils.
- The child can also explore the concept of perspective by drawing the different animals in the story from different angles.
- They can create a collage using cut-out pictures from magazines or newspapers, representing the different objects or animals mentioned in the book.

English Language Arts

- The child can develop their reading skills by following along with the text as it is read aloud. They can practice recognizing sight words and sounding out new words.
