Art

- The child practiced visual organization by categorizing and arranging the Pokemon cards by type, color, or evolution stage.
- They demonstrated creativity by designing their own card dividers with different Pokemonthemed drawings.
- They developed fine motor skills by handling the cards carefully to avoid bending or damaging them.

English Language Arts

- The child practiced reading and recognizing the names of different Pokemon species on the cards.
- They improved their vocabulary by learning and using specific terms related to Pokemon types, abilities, and evolutions.
- They engaged in storytelling and imaginative play by creating narratives and battles using the Pokemon cards.
