## **Social Studies**

- The child has learned about the different continents and oceans by labeling them on the globe worksheet.
- They have also gained an understanding of the concept of the Earth as a spherical shape.
- Through the activity, the child has developed fine motor skills by carefully writing and coloring the labels on the globe.
- They have learned about the importance of maps and globes as tools for understanding the world around them.
