Social Studies

- The child learned about the concept of movement and progress by playing the Snakes and Ladders game. They understood that moving forward on the board represents progress, while landing on a snake means going backward.
- Through the game, the child also grasped the idea of chance and luck. They learned that sometimes luck plays a role in our journey, as landing on a ladder can help us move ahead quickly.
- Snakes and Ladders also introduced the concept of rewards and consequences. The child understood that landing on a ladder brings a reward, while landing on a snake results in a consequence or setback.
- Additionally, the game helped the child develop basic counting skills. They learned to count the number of spaces they moved and understand the concept of forward and backward counting.

Continued development related to the Snakes and Ladders activity can be encouraged by creating a personalized game board. The child can design their own board, incorporating different themes or topics they are interested in. This will not only enhance their creativity but also reinforce the concepts learned during the activity.
