## Math

- The child practiced counting and sequencing while assembling the dinosaur construction set.
- They learned about shapes and spatial reasoning as they connected different parts of the dinosaur.
- By following the instructions, they developed problem-solving skills and learned about measurement through connecting specific pieces together.
- They also practiced basic addition and subtraction as they counted and adjusted the number of pieces needed.

## **Physical Education**

- The child engaged in physical activity while assembling the construction set, involving fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination.
