Social Studies

- The child learned about the concepts of culture and diversity by exploring different traditions and customs from around the world.
- They gained an understanding of geography through mapping activities and learning about different landforms and regions.
- They explored the concept of citizenship by discussing rights and responsibilities and engaging in activities that promote good citizenship.
- They learned about history by studying significant events and historical figures and understanding their impact on the present.

Encourage the child to continue their social studies learning by incorporating more hands-on activities. For example, they can create a timeline of historical events using pictures and captions, conduct interviews with family members about their cultural heritage, or explore their local community to understand its history and development.
