- The child has learned about colors and color mixing by sorting the toys into different color piles.
- They have developed their observation skills as they identify the different colors of the toys.
- Through this activity, the child may also learn about the concept of categorization and sorting.
- They have the opportunity to practice fine motor skills as they handle and sort the toys.

Encourage continued development by introducing more complex sorting activities, such as sorting by shades of color or incorporating patterns into the sorting process. You can also extend this activity by discussing the science behind colors and the mixing of primary colors to create secondary colors.
