# Art

- The student practiced visual communication and expression by interpreting verbal descriptions into drawings.

# **English Language Arts**

- The activity enhanced the student's vocabulary as they tried to match words with visual representations.
- It encouraged storytelling and narrative development as they interpreted and explained the drawings and guessed the original prompt.
- It fostered communication and presentation skills as they described their drawings and explained their thought process to others.

# Math

- The game involved logical reasoning and deduction as the student tried to guess the original prompt based on the drawing and the clues provided.
- It required spatial reasoning and visualization skills as they translated words into visual representations and vice versa.
- It promoted problem-solving and critical thinking as they tried to make sense of ambiguous or abstract drawings.
