

- The child learned to quickly identify and match numbers by playing the fast-paced card game.
- They practiced addition and subtraction skills by mentally calculating the values of the cards they played.
- The child learned to strategize and plan ahead by deciding which cards to play in order to create number sequences or complete sets.
- They practiced counting and comparing numbers by keeping track of the cards in their Nertz pile and comparing it to their opponents' piles.
- The child learned to quickly recognize patterns and sequences by arranging the cards in numerical order.

Continued development related to the activity:

1. Encourage the child to create their own variations of the game, such as using multiplication or division instead of addition and subtraction, to further practice different math skills.
2. Have the child keep a scorecard and calculate their own scores after each round, helping them practice addition and subtraction in a real-life context.
3. Introduce other math-related card games, such as "War" or "Go Fish," to further strengthen their number recognition and counting skills.
