## Art

- The child can use creativity and imagination in designing the track layout and any accompanying scenery.
- By building the track, the child learns about shapes, patterns, and design elements.
- Color choices for the track and any additional elements can be explored and discussed in relation to visual appeal.

# **English Language Arts**

- The child can practice following instructions and interpreting visual diagrams from the track set.
- Vocabulary words related to cars, tracks, and construction can be introduced and reinforced through the activity.
- Storytelling can be incorporated by encouraging the child to create narratives around the cars and their journey on the track.

### Math

- The child can learn about measurements, distances, and angles while configuring the track layout.
- Counting and comparing the number of track pieces and cars can reinforce basic math concepts.
- Understanding velocity and speed can be introduced through the movement of the cars on the track.

# **Physical Education**

- The child can engage in physical activity by setting up, adjusting, and playing with the track.
- Hand-eye coordination can be developed through maneuvering the cars along the track.
- Basic physics principles, such as force and motion, can be observed and discussed during playtime.

### Science

- Exploration of gravity and momentum can be experienced through the cars' movements on the track.
