Social Studies

- The concept of ancient Greek myths and heroes, such as Achilles, as part of world history and culture.
- Understanding the idea of courage and bravery as demonstrated by Achilles in the story.
- Introduction to the geography of ancient Greece and the significance of the Trojan War in Greek mythology.
- Learning about the values and characteristics of Greek heroes and their impact on society and culture.
