

- Reading comprehension: The child has practiced reading instructions and understanding game rules in order to play "robloks".
- Vocabulary development: Through interacting with the game's environment and characters, the child has been exposed to new words and their meanings.
- Writing skills: The child may have engaged in in-game chat or communication with other players, which promotes written expression and communication.
- Critical thinking: "robloks" requires problem-solving skills and decision-making, encouraging the child to think critically and make strategic choices.
- Sequencing: The child has learned to follow a sequence of steps or actions within the game to accomplish tasks or progress in the gameplay.

For continued development related to the activity, encourage the child to:

- Explore and play different games within Roblox that focus on specific English Language Arts skills, such as word puzzles or creative writing challenges.
- Read and follow in-game stories or narratives to further enhance reading comprehension.
- Engage in conversations with other players in a positive and meaningful way to further develop their writing skills.
- Create their own games within Roblox, allowing them to exercise their creativity, writing skills, and critical thinking while designing gameplay and narratives.
- Look for opportunities to collaborate with other players on game development projects to enhance teamwork and communication skills.
