## Math

- The student can learn about counting and matching while dressing the dolls with different clothes.

- The student can understand the concept of symmetry while dressing the dolls symmetrically.

# **Physical Education**

- The activity promotes fine motor skills as the student manipulates the small doll clothes.
- It encourages movement and coordination as the student reaches, bends, and moves around while dressing the dolls.
