

Art

- Understanding creativity and imagination by designing fun activities and crafts for the child they are babysitting, such as drawing, painting, or creating arts and crafts projects.
- Developing visual literacy by reading and interpreting picture books with the child, discussing the illustrations, and creating their own artwork inspired by the stories.
- Enhancing spatial awareness by organizing and setting up play areas with toys and art supplies, considering the layout and design to make the space engaging and safe for the child.

English Language Arts

- Improving communication skills through storytelling and reading aloud to the child, using different voices and expressions to engage their imagination.
- Developing writing skills by assisting the child in writing their own stories or journaling about their experiences during the babysitting session.
- Enhancing vocabulary by introducing the child to new words through discussion and through reading age-appropriate books together.

Math

Outdoor Education

- Learning about nature and the environment by taking the child on walks, exploring the backyard, or visiting a nearby park to observe plants, insects, and wildlife.
- Developing an appreciation for outdoor activities and physical fitness by engaging in games such as tag, hide and seek, or playing with a ball in an open space.
- Understanding safety and responsibility by teaching the child about potential hazards and how to behave safely outdoors, such as looking both ways before crossing the street.

Physical Education

- Promoting physical activity and exercise by engaging in active play with the child, such as dancing, stretching, or playing sports in a safe and supervised environment.
- Encouraging coordination and balance through activities that involve movement and physical challenges, such as obstacle courses or simple yoga poses.

- Exploring community and citizenship by discussing the roles of different community members and promoting positive values such as respect, kindness, and cooperation.

Encourage them to take the initiative and engage in age-appropriate learning activities to broaden their knowledge and understanding while fostering their creativity and nurturing positive relationships with the child they are caring for.
