- The student learned how to effectively convey emotions and personality traits through actions and dialogue, as the faceless character relies on body language and verbal cues to express themselves.
- They practiced using descriptive language and sensory details to paint a vivid picture of the character's surroundings and interactions without directly describing their physical appearance.
- The student developed their understanding of symbolism and metaphor, using objects and symbols to represent the character's identity and motivations instead of relying on physical attributes.

For continued development, students can explore different viewpoints by writing from the perspectives of other characters who interact with the faceless character. They can also experiment with non-linear storytelling to add depth and complexity to the character's narrative.
