- Learned about syllable count and structure through composing a haiku poem
- Explored the concept of nature and seasons as common themes in haiku poetry
- Practiced using descriptive language and imagery through the crafting of a haiku
- Understood the importance of brevity and precision in conveying emotions and observations

Encourage continued development by introducing other forms of poetry and challenging the student to experiment with different writing styles. Provide opportunities for them to share their haiku poems with peers and receive feedback to further refine their poetic skills.
