- The student learned about meal planning and budgeting by using the eMeals app, which involved reading recipes, managing grocery lists, and understanding the cost of ingredients.
- Through the app, the student also practiced writing and communication skills by creating personalized meal plans and sharing them with family members.
- By using the app, the student improved their vocabulary related to food and cooking, as well
 as gained exposure to different writing styles through recipe descriptions and cooking
 instructions.

Continued development related to this activity can include exploring food-related literature or taking a creative writing approach by creating fictional characters who plan their meals using a similar app, incorporating dialogue and descriptive language to bring the characters and their meal plans to life.
