Art

- The student explored colors and shapes by creating different toppings for the playdough pizza, promoting creativity and imagination.
- They practiced fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination while rolling, pressing, and shaping the playdough into the desired pizza crust and toppings.
- Using the playdough as a medium allowed the child to express their ideas and emotions, encouraging self-expression and communication.

English

- The student engaged in pretend play by acting as a chef, taking turns to share their "pizza" with classmates, thus enhancing social and language skills.
- As the student pretended to take orders and describe the pizza they were making, they developed vocabulary and language fluency.

For continued development, consider incorporating storytelling related to making pizza, including characters, adventures, and recipes. Encourage the child to use descriptive words while playing with the playdough, which can further improve their language skills.
