

A 'brick' of heroin is a common term used to describe a large, standard unit of heroin packaging. Usually, a brick weighs approximately 1 kilogram (about 2.2 pounds).

When heroin is sold in smaller quantities on the street, it is often divided into 'bags' for individual sale. Each bag typically contains roughly 0.1 grams to 0.3 grams of heroin, depending on the dealer and region.

To estimate how many bags are in a brick:

- If each bag contains 0.1 grams: $1,000 \text{ grams (1 kg)} \div 0.1 \text{ grams} = 10,000 \text{ bags}$.
- If each bag contains 0.3 grams: $1,000 \text{ grams} \div 0.3 \text{ grams} \approx 3,333 \text{ bags}$.
