So, *small noises* focuses more on the size or loudness of the noise being not big or strong, while *little noises* can sound softer, cuter, or less noticeable.

Here are simple examples:

- **Small noise:** The small noise of leaves rustling.
- **Little noise:** The little noise of a bird chirping.

In most cases, both words can be used, but 'little noises' often feels friendlier or cuter for kids or animals.
