11. Zebras sometimes sleep standing up, and sometimes they lie down for a short rest.
12. Zebras talk to each other with sounds like brays, barks, and neighs, and they use faces and ears to show feelings.
13. There are three main kinds of zebras: plains zebra, mountain zebra, and Grevy's zebra. Each looks a little different.
14. Mom zebras take special care of their foals. They teach them how to run and where to eat.
15. Zebras groom each other by nibbling and rubbing. This helps them stay clean and make friends.
