

7 Kid-Friendly Adjectives to Describe a Desert

Here are seven easy words you can use to describe a desert. For each word you'll see a short explanation and an example sentence.

1. **Hot** — The desert can get very warm under the sun.
Example: "The desert is hot in the daytime."
2. **Dry** — A desert has very little rain, so it feels dry.
Example: "The air in the desert is dry and thirsty."
3. **Sandy** — Many deserts have lots of sand covering the ground.
Example: "We walked across the sandy dunes."
4. **Dusty** — Wind can lift tiny bits of sand and dirt, making the air dusty.
Example: "My shoes were dusty after playing in the desert."
5. **Windy** — Deserts often have strong winds that move sand into ripples.
Example: "It was windy, and the sand blew across the path."
6. **Sunny** — Deserts usually have lots of bright sunshine.
Example: "The sunny sky made everything sparkle."
7. **Vast** — Deserts can stretch out very far so they look big and wide.
Example: "We could see the vast desert for miles."

2. Make your own sentence about a desert using that adjective.
3. Draw a picture to match your sentence (for example, draw a sunny, sandy desert with big dunes).
