

What are Taxes?

Why Do We Pay Taxes?

When people earn money from their jobs, they give a portion of that money to the government as taxes. This is often done automatically through paycheck deductions. Other times, people may need to pay taxes on purchases they make, like buying a toy or a video game. This is called sales tax.
