

Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns in a sentence. They help to avoid repetition and make sentences clearer and more fluid. Below are examples of sentences containing pronouns, with a clear indication of each pronoun included:

- Sarah loves her dog. **(her)** is a pronoun that replaces Sarah's ownership of the dog.
- John is going to the store, and he will buy some milk. **(he)** is a pronoun that stands in for John.
- The books are on the table. Can you see them? **(them)** refers back to the books.
- The cat licked its paws. **(its)** is a possessive pronoun that shows ownership of the paws by the cat.
- Jessica and I went to the park. We had a great time. **(We)** is a pronoun that includes both Jessica and the speaker.
