

Hey Vienna! So, when someone says something is **superficial**, it means that it's only about the surface or the outside, and not about what's really deep or important.

Imagine you have a toy that looks really cool and shiny on the outside, but when you play with it, you find out it doesn't work well at all. The outside looks good, but the toy isn't as great as it seems. That's what superficial means—being focused just on how something looks instead of how it really is on the inside.

We can also use the word to talk about people. If someone only cares about what someone looks like or only talks about surface things, like clothes or money, they are being superficial. They are not looking at the deeper qualities of a person, like kindness or friendship.

In short, superficial is about what's on the outside rather than what's really important on the inside!
