Talking Points

- "Ruby Bridges was a brave little girl who helped make our world a better place."
- "She was the first African-American child to attend an all-white school in New Orleans."
- "Ruby faced many challenges and had to be escorted by U.S. Marshals to keep her safe."
- "She showed us that we should treat everyone with kindness and respect, no matter their skin color."
- "Ruby's story teaches us the importance of equality and standing up against discrimination."
