Activities

- Activity 1: Map Exploration - Use the world map or globe to identify different countries and continents. Locate major historical civilizations or events on the map and mark them.
- Activity 2: Timeline Creation - Create a timeline of historical events, focusing on events related to geography. Include important discoveries, explorations, or conflicts that shaped the world.
- Activity 3: Research Project - Choose a historical civilization or region of interest. Research its geography, climate, and natural resources. Write a short report highlighting the impact of these factors on the civilization's development.

Talking Points

- Geography is the study of the Earth's physical features, climate, and how they influence human activities.

- Understanding the geography of a historical period can help us make sense of why certain events occurred and how they shaped the world we live in today.
- By studying both geography and history, we can gain a deeper appreciation for the interconnectedness of our world and the factors that have influenced human societies throughout time.
