Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a basic understanding of Women's history month and the contributions of notable women throughout history.

Materials and Prep

- Internet access (optional)
- Paper and crayons/markers
- Books about women's history (optional)

Activities

- Create a collage: Provide the student with magazines or printed images of women from different time periods. Let them cut out the images and glue them onto a piece of paper to create a collage representing women's history.
- Dress-up game: Collect various costumes or clothing items that represent different professions or historical periods. Allow the student to dress up and pretend to be different women from history while discussing their contributions.
- Storytime: Read age-appropriate books about notable women in history. Encourage the student to ask questions and engage in discussions about the stories.
- Draw and talk: Ask the student to draw their favorite woman from history and explain why they admire her. Have a conversation about the qualities and achievements of the chosen woman.

Talking Points

- **Notable women:** There are many amazing women who have made a difference in the world. Some examples include Rosa Parks, Amelia Earhart, Marie Curie, and Malala Yousafzai.
- **Contributions:** Women have contributed to various fields such as science, literature, art, sports, and politics. They have broken barriers and achieved great things.
- **Equality:** Women have fought for equal rights and opportunities. It is important to treat everyone with respect and give them the same chances to succeed.
