## Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of London's art, history, and culture.

## **Materials and Prep**

- Pen or pencil
- Blank paper or sketchbook
- Access to a computer or tablet with internet
- Printouts of famous London landmarks (optional)

Prior knowledge of basic art techniques and some knowledge about London would be helpful but not required.

## Activities

- 5. London trivia quiz: Prepare a list of trivia questions about London's history, landmarks, and culture. Challenge the student to answer as many questions correctly as possible. You can make it a fun competition by keeping score.
