

Objective

By the end of this lesson, the student will have a better understanding of the Middle East, including its history, geography, culture, and contributions to the world.

Materials and Prep

- Map of the Middle East
- Notebook and pen/pencil
- Access to the internet or books for research

Prior knowledge needed: Basic understanding of world geography and history.

Activities
