

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will have a better understanding of the Viking era and its connection to Minecraft. You will also learn about Viking culture, their exploration, and their impact on history.

Materials and Prep

- A computer with Minecraft installed
- Internet access
- Paper and pen/pencil

No specific knowledge is required before starting this lesson. Just come with an open mind and a willingness to learn!

Activities

- **1. Minecraft Viking Village:** Use Minecraft to create your own Viking village. Research Viking architecture and design, and try to incorporate authentic elements into your virtual village.
- **2. Viking Exploration:** Research famous Viking explorers such as Leif Erikson and Erik the Red. Create a timeline of their journeys and mark the places they discovered on a map.
- **3. Viking Mythology:** Learn about Norse mythology and the gods worshipped by the Vikings. Create a poster or write a short story based on one of the myths.
- **4. Viking Crafts:** Try your hand at Viking-inspired crafts such as making a shield, weaving a bracelet, or creating a miniature longship out of household materials.

Talking Points

- **Vikings and Minecraft:** "Did you know that Minecraft draws inspiration from Viking culture? Many of the game's biomes, structures, and items are influenced by Viking history."
