Activities

Talking Points

- **Chaucer's Influence:** In the 14th century, the English poet Geoffrey Chaucer wrote a poem called "Parliament of Fowls," which linked Valentine's Day with romantic love. This helped popularize the idea of Valentine's Day as a day for expressing love and affection.
