

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to learn and sing parts of the Choir song "This is Me" from The Greatest Showman.

Materials and Prep

Materials needed: Computer, Internet access, a device to play music.

Prior knowledge required: None! Just bring your enthusiasm and love for singing.

Activities

1. Warm-up your voice by doing some vocal exercises like sirens or lip trills.
2. Listen to the song "This is Me" and try to memorize the chorus.
3. Practice singing along with the song, focusing on the melody and rhythm.
4. Create your own choreography or hand movements to go along with the song.
5. Record yourself singing the song and watch it back to see your progress.

Talking Points

- Creating choreography or hand movements adds a fun element to our performance. It helps us express the emotions of the song through our body movements and enhances our overall presentation.
- Recording yourself singing is a great way to track your progress. You can listen to your recordings and see how you've improved over time. Remember, the most important thing is to have fun and enjoy the music!
