

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to identify and use action verbs in English sentences.

Materials and Prep

- Paper
- Pencils or markers

Activities

- Draw a picture of a person doing an action (e.g., running, jumping, eating). Label the action with the correct verb.
- Play charades with family members or friends. Act out different actions while others guess the verb.
- Create a mini-story using at least five action verbs. Share your story with someone else.

Talking Points

- What are action verbs? Action verbs are words that show what someone or something is doing. For example, "jump," "run," and "sing" are action verbs.
- Why are action verbs important? Action verbs make sentences more exciting and help us understand what is happening in a story or conversation.
- Can you give examples of action verbs? Sure! Some examples of action verbs are: "dance," "swim," "read," "climb," and "laugh."
- Let's practice! Can you act out the action verb "jump"? Great job! That's a fun action verb to show in real life.
- Useful phrases to learn: "I am running in the park." "She is singing a song." "The cat is sleeping on the bed."
