

Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to read and comprehend a short story about Paw Patrol.

Materials and Prep

- A Paw Patrol book or a printed short story about Paw Patrol
- Pen or pencil
- Printed activity sheets (optional)

Before starting the lesson, make sure you are familiar with the characters and storyline of Paw Patrol.

Activities

1. Introduce the story: Start by showing the Paw Patrol book or printed story to the student. Discuss the cover and ask them to predict what the story might be about.
2. Read the story aloud: Read the story aloud to the student, emphasizing expression and fluency. Encourage the student to follow along with their finger as you read.
3. Ask comprehension questions: After reading the story, ask the student questions to check their understanding. For example, "Who are the main characters in the story?" or "What problem did the Paw Patrol solve?"
4. Retell the story: Have the student retell the story in their own words. This can be done verbally or through drawing pictures of the main events.
5. Extension activity: If you have printed activity sheets, provide them to the student to reinforce their reading skills. These activities can include coloring characters, matching words to pictures, or completing simple sentences.

First Grade Talking Points

- "Today, we are going to read a story about Paw Patrol."
- "Paw Patrol is a group of brave and helpful puppies who work together to solve problems."
- "When we read a story, it's important to pay attention to the words and pictures to understand what's happening."
- "After we finish reading, we will talk about the story and answer questions to make sure we understood it."
- "You can also draw pictures or tell me in your own words what happened in the story."
- "If you want to do some extra activities, we have some fun worksheets for you to practice what you've learned."
