Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to understand and use capital letters and full stops correctly in sentences.

Materials and Prep

Materials needed: Pencil and paper.

No prior knowledge required.

Activities

- 1. Capital Letter Hunt: Go around your house and find objects that start with capital letters. Write them down.
- 2. Story Time: Write a short story using capital letters and full stops. Be as creative as you can!
- 3. Sentence Sorting: Cut out words from old magazines or newspapers and create sentences with correct capitalization and punctuation.

Talking Points

- Capital letters are like the superheroes of words. They stand out and show importance. Remember to always use a capital letter at the beginning of a sentence. Say: "Every sentence needs a superhero to start it off. That superhero is the capital letter!"
- Full stops are like red lights for sentences. They tell us when to stop. Say: "When you see a full stop, it's like a red light telling you to stop and take a breath."
- Capital letters are also used for names of people, places, and things. Say: "Names of people, places, and things are like celebrities in the sentence world. They get to wear capital letters all the time!"
- Practice makes perfect! The more you practice using capital letters and full stops, the better you will become at writing clear and neat sentences. Say: "Just like playing a game, the more you practice, the better you get. So, let's have fun with capital letters and full stops!"
