Materials and Prep

- Optional: Titanic movie or documentary

Activities

- **Art:** Draw a picture of the Titanic sinking and share what emotions it evokes.
- **English:** Write a short story from the perspective of a passenger on the Titanic.
- **History:** Research and create a timeline of the events leading up to the Titanic sinking.
- **Science:** Conduct a sink or float experiment to understand buoyancy like the Titanic's design.

Talking Points

- **What was the Titanic?**
"The Titanic was a huge ship that was supposed to be unsinkable but tragically sank on its maiden voyage."
- **Why was the Titanic important?**
"The Titanic was important because its sinking led to better safety regulations for ships."
- **How did the Titanic sink?**
"The Titanic hit an iceberg which caused it to take on water and eventually sink."
- **Who were some famous passengers on the Titanic?**
"Some famous passengers were John Jacob Astor IV and Molly Brown."
- **What lessons can we learn from the Titanic?**
"We can learn the importance of safety measures and how even the biggest plans can have flaws."
